One Year Intensive Training in Narrative Practice 2024 - 2025

About the couse

Are you struck by narrative ideas? Would you be interested to join this new journey? The One Year Intensive Training in Narrative Practice is designed for people who would want to explore further individual and collective narrative practice in the local context. Participants must have completed an introductory course on narrative practice of no less than 24 hours.

The course consists of 5 standalone modules, a total of 102 hours. Apart from group and individual supervisions, there are 2 2-day workshops by international trainers, 10 workshops/lectures by local trainers as well as 13 tutorial sessions of which 8 are supervised practice sessions.

Participants will also complete a reading and writing program and a written project in which they apply narrative ideas in their own context. Assignments include:

- 10 reflection papers
- 2 taped conversations with reflection
- · Written report on a project
- Presentation of the project

Award

Participants who will have attended 85% of the sessions and completed all assignments and a presentation of their project will be awarded a certificate by Hong Kong Marriage and Family Therapy Association.

Upon completion of the course and meeting of the entry requirements, graduates can apply for Recognition of Prior Learning to the University of Melbourne in relation to the Master of Narrative Therapy and Community Work. Each application will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
